KATHPUTLIS OF RAJASTHAN



Marionettes or string puppets are known as kathputli (kath meaning wood, and putli meaning doll). This ancient art form has long served to entertain, provide social commentary, and convey important information. The traditional set of puppets for the Amar Singh Rathore play used to be of 52 characters. But now the puppeteers use only a few characters whose identity they have modified to suit the current needs of the public. So, the puppeteers are sharp in sensing the taste and sensibility of the crowd and adapt the show accordingly. Nowadays, the puppeteers make small cheap non-functional puppets, varying from 2 to 2 ft. length, and sell them to domestic and foreign tourists, and earn their major part of income form this.

Uniqueness

Rajasthani string puppets are perhaps the only example of their kind in the world where a control or cross is not used for manipulation. In other words, all the strings are attached to the puppeteers' fingers directly, which demand a great deal of virtuosity. These puppets are operated with strings. The strings vary from 2 to 8, the larger the puppets, the more the movement and agility of the character.

Method of Production

Artisans start by designing and carving the puppets from lightweight wood, shaping and painting them with traditional patterns and vibrant colors. Strings are then attached directly to the puppets' limbs and body, requiring precise control from the puppeteers' fingers. The puppets are dressed in elaborate costumes with intricate embroidery and detailed accessories. Final adjustments are made to the strings for smooth movement and balance. After thorough testing and rehearsal, the kathputlis are ready for performance, blending craftsmanship with cultural storytelling.
