The specialized yarn pre-treatment and dyeing techniques, the use of three shuttles during weaving, and the application of earthen pots contribute to its exceptional character. Furthermore, the detailed tribal motifs and the significant manual effort involved highlight its uniqueness, justifying its protection under the G.I. of Goods Act 99.
