The production involves refining raw clay which is further molded, hand shaped or cast into various forms. After the initial shaping, the clay is partially dried, decorated with unique designs & fired to kilns to harden. Later, natural colors are applied for finishing. This whole process requires skilled & experienced craftsmanship.
