Initially ritual items, they are now elegant wall hangings and mementoes, reflecting exceptional artistry and cultural heritage. These exquisite pieces are admired as treasured showpieces.

### Uniqueness

Tanjore Art Plates are renowned for intricate tri-metal craftsmanship combining brass, copper, and silver. Featuring mythological figures and floral patterns, they display skilled techniques like graving, dovetail union, and encrusting.

### Raw Materials

Brass Sheets, Copper Foils, Silver Foils, Beeswax with Kungilium, Lead Molds, Brass Rivets, Hydrochloric Acid and Soap Powder.

### Method of Production

Thanjavur Art Plates are crafted by shaping brass sheets and embossing copper or silver foils using moulds. Wax and "Kungilium" reinforce the foils, which are fixed with decorative brass rivets. The final product is polished with hydrochloric acid and soap powder, resulting in a detailed and elegant finish.
